Please do not pass on messages or information to teachers or Pupil Support Assistants at the beginning and end of the school day in the playground. Although this seems like a sensible, quick way to share information, the teachers have a number of duties at these times and are responsible for the safety of pupils and the security of the school. There have been occasions where messages were not passed on/overlooked and this has caused unnecessary upset. Please pop round to the school office where Miss Tweedale will be happy to help you and ensure your information is shared appropriately. If your **child feels unwell** within the school day they will always be seen by a qualified first aider. Often they will be offered a water or some fresh air and then closely monitored in class to ensure they are well enough for school. At other times, we will contact you because we believe your child is not fit for school and you will be asked to collect them. As we are not medical professionals we are unable to undertake any sort of medical assessments; this includes taking your child's temperature. We will ask you to collect them and seek medical advice.

All medication, whether prescribed or non prescribed, must be given/collected via the school office at the start and end of each day. All medication (creams, ointments, anti-biotics, short term medication etc.) requires a form to be completed. **PLEASE DO NOT SEND IN ANY MEDICATION INTO SCHOOL VIA YOUR CHILD.**

We had a simply astonishing turn out for our first ever **Meet the Teacher Event** on Thursday 12<sup>th</sup> of September with over 50% of families attending. The feedback was overwhelmingly positive particularly about the following:

- the chance to meet your child's teacher but also being introduced to the larger staff team
- opportunities to see your child's classroom
- hearing about class routines both daily and weekly
- chatting to other parents and families
- hearing a little about school improvement priorities for this session
- hearing about the planned learning for the year and what is happening when!

Next session we intend to run the same event again but will perhaps tweak to ensure:

- the information about routines and school expectations are more specific to each year group
- more time is spent discussing the expectations for home learning and how parents/can help their child at home (see our website where there is plenty of advice about this!)
- that we limit the event to 'meet the teacher' and the Parent Council AGM; some parents/carers felt there was just a little too much to take in over the course of the evening and would have preferred more time to socialise informally in the hall.

### ATTAINMENT UPDATE

I am proud to present our pupil attainment data from last session. Our attainment is above the Edinburgh average in nearly all areas. This is the result of hard work, effort and dedication from our whole school community; pupils, parents/carers, teachers including support for learning, pupil support assistants, cluster colleagues and numerous professional partners including Speech and Language, English as an Additional Language and Educational Psychology.
