Healthy social and emotional development in childhood has been shown to be positively associated with better educational outcomes; Ms Richard will work across the school to promote all aspects of wellbeing.



#### **SPIFOX REPORT**

In October 2019 we were approached by members of the SPIFOX (Scottish Property Index Festival of Christmas) Board inviting us to read and perform at their annual carol concert. As a school we had already been increasing participation in the arts and had established a P4-P7 choir in November 2018 shortly after the new Head Teacher and Principal Teacher were appointed. The SPIFOX Board explained that their 2018 Carol Concert raised £330 000 and, despite the enormity of the event, the staff and choir felt confident we could work hard and rise to the challenge.

Tireless rehearsals followed and pupils were selected to read and perform solos at the event. Simultaneously, the upper school pupils took part in an art competition to design the front and back pages of the 2019 Carol Concert Programme. We were asked to submit photographs and biographies for our artists, reader and soloists to be published along with a picture of our choir and an outline of their story.

St Andrew's Fox Covert RC Primary School Choir gave an initial performance at a school assembly in November 2018. Since then we have grown and developed, performing to audiences big and small at both formal and informal events. Like all choirs we are interested in ensuring a broad repertoire, a fun experience and high quality performances however that's just the surface of what we're about. Our choir is actually all about authentic participation. Participation includes all of the ways in which we engage with our school and wider community to create positive outcomes and changes. Participation means giving each and every one of us an opportunity for personal achievement in an extended curriculum; a chance to be truly involved. Our school values are nurture inspire flourish and our choir embodies these principles. We look forward to 'sharing our shine' with you this morning!



On Wednesday, 18<sup>th</sup> of December our choir and winning artists travelled to St Cuthbert's Church on Lothian Road and gave the performance of their lives! The event went off without a hitch and

the response to our performers was overwhelming. A SPIFOX trustee wrote to congratulate us on 'a truly remarkable performance for which were received multiple positive comments, the readers too were the subject of much praise for their timing and delivery'. They also shared with us that the original pieces of art designed by our winning pupils sold for £2000 each!

The impact of this outstanding work on our learners and school might best be summed up in three words offered by the choir as they arrived back at school after the performance: thrilling, challenging, belonging.

We really did share our shine!

There have not been many opportunities to be outside at break and lunch 'whatever the weather' in fact last term there was just 1 chance. It is essential that your child brings in wet weather gear and wellies to school each day (or leaves a set here)! Please name all items. If you require support to obtain waterproofs or wellies, we have a number of donated boots and jackets here. Simply contact the school office. As we get more experienced and have more wet days, we will explore the best way to store and dry wet weather gear and refine our systems.

The Primary 7 pupils are busy preparing from Cluster Camp. Miss Monaghan and Miss Glen will accompany them to the Lake District in February for 4 nights away from home learning in the great outdoors. Watch this space for updates!

The Pupil Parliament organised a fantastic **School Feast Day** in November. Everyone agrees that celebrating our patron Saint is an important part of being a pupil or staff member here at St Andrew's. The ice cream was DELICIOUS and the performances by Tricky Ricky had the whole school, adults included, roaring with laughter. Thank you to the Parent Council for funding the two performances. Wonderful!

We are working with our friends and neighbours from Fox Covert Primary to develop **Loose Parts Play** in our playground. The key characteristics of play include fun, uncertainty, challenge, flexibility and non-productivity. Through accessing loose parts materials our learners can extend their creativity through experimenting, discovering, communicating, inventing and have fun. More details to follow.

Congratulations to the pupils of Primary 3 who made the Sacrament of Reconciliation on Wednesday 11th December. Please remember them in your prayers.

Scottish Week is coming up (20-24 January). Our classes are busy planning their learning for the week and are starting to learn their poems. Please join us for our Burns Assembly at 10:45am on Friday 24th January in the school hall.

Our draft Playground Charter (shared with our friends and neighbours from Fox Covert Primary School) will be shared with pupils this week. More details to follow in the next newsletter.

I will continue to work with Primary 6 to promote the school's new **anti-bullying procedure**. The full version is available on our website and Primary 6 have made a fantastic display in the centre of our school. They are now working to create a bespoke pupil version that is accessible to all.

We know that 1 in 5 children in our city live in poverty and we are working hard to **poverty proof** our school and **reduce the cost of the school day**. Please remember that we can offer second hand uniform and referrals to the local foodbank should you require. We know how important and valuable **educational excursions** are to our pupils; indeed your children are telling us they would like regular opportunities to learn outside of the classroom. Unfortunately, excursions and events usually incur additional costs which can place financial pressure onto families. Going forward therefore families will be asked for a voluntary contribution for all excursions (other than residential) and events to ensure we are **poverty proofing our school**. We know that families who can pay do pay! Additionally, if you would like to make a higher contribution knowing this would support another pupil, you will be able to do this via the main office.

You can find out all sorts of information about our work along with your child's weekly learning and home learning on our website. Please visit regularly.

Please do not pass on messages or information to teachers or Pupil Support Assistants at the beginning and end of the school day in the playground. Although this seems like a sensible, quick way to share information, the teachers have a number of duties at these times and are responsible for the safety of pupils and the security of the school. There have been occasions where messages were not passed on/ overlooked and this has caused unnecessary upset. Please pop round to the school office where Miss Tweedale will be happy to help you and ensure your information is shared appropriately. If your **child feels unwell** within the school day they will always be seen by a qualified first aider. Often they will be offered a water or some fresh air and then closely monitored in class to ensure they are well enough for school. At other times, we will contact you because we believe your child is not fit for school and you will be asked to collect them. As we are not medical professionals we are unable to undertake any sort of medical assessments; this includes taking your child's temperature. We will ask you to collect them and seek medical advice.

All medication, whether prescribed or non prescribed, must be given/collected via the school office at the start and end of each day. All medication (creams, ointments, anti-biotics, short term medication etc.) requires a form to be completed. PLEASE DO NOT SEND IN ANY MEDICATION INTO SCHOOL VIA YOUR CHILD.

The start and end of the school day are busy times on the streets surrounding the school. We have had some reports of poor parking/ congestion (and the associated frustration this brings) at the Rannoch Road/Alan Breck Gardens junction. May I ask that you continue to park as far away as possible and walk in to drop/collect your child; thank you to those that park responsibly. Please do not park on grass verges around the school as this is damaging the local environment. If you do happen to witness dangerous driving or parking, please contact Police Scotland on 101 or if urgent 999.

Please remember to telephone (0131 339 2383) or email (admin@foxcovert-rc.edin.sch.uk) the school office if your child is going to be **late/ absent.** This information should be given to the school office rather than the class teacher, head teacher or a Pupil Support Assistant.

Fox Covert Early Years Centre has started a Community Food Bank. We need your donations! Both dry/long life goods and fresh produce are needed. Thank you for your generosity- this is so supportive to many in our community.
