

We will shortly be starting our annual **Scottish National Standardised Assessments**. P1, P4 and P7 pupils complete the assessments online and they are marked automatically, giving teachers immediate feedback to help children progress in literacy and numeracy. Children do not have to revise or prepare for assessments. The assessments are used as part of routine teaching and learning to help teachers understand how well your child is progressing and to plan next steps. The assessments are just another aspect of daily learning. Your child does not have to revise or prepare for assessments.
