In Edinburgh and at St Andrew's Fox Covert RC Primary children and young people are at the heart of our vision for the future. As an inclusive community of faith and learning we work with parents, carers and, where appropriate, partner agencies to support all children and young people.

By working together, we help children and young people to develop understanding about relationships, respect, teamwork, honesty, fairness, patience, and compassion. We do this by offering interesting and relevant learning experiences, by providing our staff with the training and resources they need, and by working with the whole community to accept and care for one another. This isn't always easy, but we believe it is essential so that our children and young people understand the people they meet and learn how to work together to handle setbacks and difficult situations throughout their lives.

When children and young people experience adverse events or as a response to their additional support need, they let us know by reacting in different ways. This presents difficulties for those around them. By working together, by understanding the cause and working out solutions, we can find a way to solve or deal with a problem. If it takes time to get over a problem we will work with a child, young person, and their family to work out the best way forward. This may involve making adaptations and providing additional support or in exceptional circumstances identifying a change of environment.

We recognise that we all experience difficult times, and that everyone deserves the best possible care and support. In Edinburgh we support children and young people to learn in different ways according to their needs. As children and young people learn to read, write, and count some require more support than others do. This need for support arises for a variety of reasons learning difficulties, challenges with emotional regulation and social communication issues. We must meet the needs of all our students in a fair, compassionate, and proportionate way.

In considering how to support all children and young people reach their full potential it may not always be possible to arrive at a resolution all parties agree. However, we will listen to any parent, young person, child or member of staff and work together to resolve difficulties. Please share your concerns with us directly rather than parent to parent in the playground or using technology; this enables us to care for, understand and meet the needs of all concerned.

We are committed to do all we can to make Edinburgh an inclusive place to live and learn. Our school community is made up of parents, staff, pupils, our parish and local residents; let's ensure that everyone- adult or child- is nurtured, inspired and can flourish.

The start and end of the school day are busy times on the streets surrounding the campus. May I ask that you continue to park as far away as possible and walk in to drop/collect your child; thank you to those that park responsibly. Please do not park on grass verges around the school (particularly at the Falkland Gardens/ Clermiston Road grassy area) as this is damaging the local environment. Parking on the double yellow lines is of course prohibited and cars should not park on the dropped kerbs. Please ask yourself 'Will a small child be able to see the traffic and cross safely if I park here?' If you do happen to witness dangerous driving or parking, please contact Police Scotland on 101 or if urgent 999.

Scooter and bike parking: we are exploring options for getting a new bike store near the top gate. For now, our PSA team will support your child to bring their bike into school and we will store it safely. Thank you for scooting and cycling (and walking) to school whenever possible.

Everyone loves a birthday and we like to hear about how you and your family celebrate. Unfortunately we are unable to **accept any cakes or treats** (whether homemade or shop bought) to give out to pupils.

Please remember to telephone (0131 339 2383) or email (admin@foxcovert-rc.edin.sch.uk) the school office if your child is going to be **late/ absent.** This information should be given to the school office rather than the class teacher, head teacher or a Pupil Support Assistant.

There is much evidence to suggest that **drinking plenty water** throughout the day helps you think! The children are welcome to bring in water (not juice) to school each day to drink in the classroom. Bottles must be taken home at the end of each day and must be clearly labelled. Please note that if an unlabelled bottle comes in, a staff member will take a sharpie to it so it can be identified! Please note that our COVID risk assessments make it difficult to refill water bottles; please ensure your child has enough water for the school day. If they run out of water we will of course ensure they can refill their bottles.

As a Catholic school we understand the necessity of **prayer** in sustaining a growing relationship with God. All classes participate in daily prayer and you can find the prayers to be learned and used in each class by viewing https://foxcovertrcprimary.wordpress.com/class-prayers/ Due to current COVID-19 restrictions the pupils are currently unable to sing/ chant/ recite in unison and for this reason prayers in the lower school are said aloud by the class teacher with the pupils participating silently (this is similar to the arrangements for communal prayer within our Parish at the moment). In the upper school, individual pupils may lead the prayers for their class. Even in the busiest of times we are committed to praying at least 4 times a day (at beginning/ end of the day and before/ after lunch) with additional time for prayer and reflection being an important aspect of curricular RE.

We all have a **duty to protect children**, whether we are professionals or private individuals. If you think a child is being or is at risk of being abused or neglected, speak to:
